On the season Sophia hit .297 with 1 HR, 17 RBIs, 14 runs scored (using a courtesy runner when catching) Stats don't tell full impact that Sophia has for our team, she hits left-handed, slaps left handed and hit from the right side. She showed considerable growth in her short game this year, she was frequently called upon to advance runners and confuse the defense. She is a key offensive and defensive player for our team.
